I hope the year has been good for all and the forthcoming year is going to be challenging due to tough competition in the industry, especially with increasing number of colleges being upgraded to either University College status or those with University College status being upgraded to a full University.

At the same time the number of school leavers remains almost constant as the number of students taking the SPM examination has been around 450,000 over the recent years Therefore the way forward is to attract more international students as per the national aspirations to make Malaysia and education hub. Malaysia is the 12th most preferred destination generating RM7.9 billion per year.

To facilitate enrolment of international students, EMGS has allowed students to apply for student pass directly online to EMGS. Also international student passes will be issued for the total duration of study. Also international graduates will be given employment pass in critical and high technology areas for a period not exceeding two years after graduation.

There is great emphasis by the MoHE to promote student mobility programs for which certain immigration regulations have been relaxed to facilitate this. For less than three months, social visit passes will be issued. For 3 – 12 months course, student pass for mobility will be issued. The mobility programme will allow credit transfer to take place.

I urge all members to contact me if they have any issues in bringing international students which would be brought up by NAPEI at the International Education Task Force (IETF) meeting chaired by the minister.

NAPEI is represented at a number of ministerial committees and its related agencies. The recent one being NAPEI given the Deputy Chair at the Malaysian International Education Council. The Chair is from the IPTA. This will also enable as a Public Private Partnership (PPP) by the MoHE

Those offering skills programmes, there is great opportunity because both the Higher Education Blueprint and the 11th Malaysia Plan (RMK11) have great emphasis on TVET programmes.

NAPEI is registering with the HRDF as a training provider under the NGO category and we expect some allocation in the form of grant be given to NAPEI to carry out training programmes for the members. For the private school sector we are planning to get support from PEMANDU for additional grants for international promotion.

On the corporate side those who wish to expand their partnerships and collaborations can do so by meeting the delegates from Sichuan, China. NAPEI is working in organising an Expo for 18 universities from the Sichuan Province who will be here for a one-day Expo at Cititel Hotel, Midvallley on 20 April 2016. Pemandu has ceased providing fund for branding International Schools. However, we have a healthy Financial Status through prudent and cost effective management with an increase in fixed deposits and activities that are self-financed. The various events and activities have ensured a surplus income over the approved budget. The balance funds from the RM700,000 received for capability building in 2012 was used for our 3rd NAPEI International skills conference 2014. A fund of RM 600,000 received end year 2013 was used for international schools branding for Year 2014 in countries approved by Pemandu namely Seoul, South Korea, Ho Chih Minh, Vietnam, Jakarta, Indonesia and Singapore. From the RM 600,000 received from Pemandu, an administrative income of 10% goes to NAPEI on international schools branding projects organized by NAPEI. NAPEI's cost effective measures ensures the financial success of the branding programe. Our Treasurer's report will give more details on our financial status. We thank our treasurer Mr Varatha Raju for doing a wonderful and highly efficient job with the accounts keeping.

THE SECRETARIAT

We wish to put on record the efficient work done by our Executive Secretary Ms Betty Ng for successfully managing our secretariat.

In conclusion, we would like to express our thanks to all member institutions which have strongly supported the National Council by providing facilities for our various meetings, for participating in the various training programmes, for joining our education fairs, annual dinners as well as for advising, assisting and cooperating with us in all our activities to ensure the continued success of NAPEI.

4.2 TREASURER'S REPORT - reported by General Treasurer Mr Varatha Raju Munusamy

NAPEI each year carries out our various activities to generate revenue. As for the financial year ending 31st December 2015 it generated a total revenue of RM 179,378.00 from its operations. The operating expenditure before taxation was RM 108,209.00 and Taxation was RM 1,475.00. The net income for the financial year ending 31st December 2015 after deducting expenditure and taxation is RM 69,694.00

NAPEI's total income for the year was RM179,378.00. The revenue was derived from the following activities.

- 1) Subscription fee received from members institutions
- 2) Endorsement Fees for NAPEI Education Fair.
- Administering, Organising, Managing and promoting Malaysian International schools
 Education overseas to upscale the International schools and to promote foreign students to
 study in these schools in Malaysia.

In reference to item 3 above, the balance of NAPEI grant of Ringgit Malaysia Six Hundred Thousand (RM600,000.00) by PEMANDU (Prime Minister Department) end Year 2013 was used for the purpose of administrating, organising, managing and promoting Malaysian International schools education overseas to upscale the International schools and to attract them to study in Malaysia.

NAPEI is proud to announce that in November 2012, we were recognized by the Malaysian Government as the Champion for EPP3- Ramping up International School under our government's Economic Transformation Programme.(reference website:- http://etp.pemandu.gov.my) PEMANDU has also agreed to provide NAPEI a grant of Ringgit Malaysia Three Million (RM 3 million) for branding international schools through feasibility studies overseas, promotion at overseas education exhibition

and road shows in countries and cities discussed and approved by PEMANDU with a view to attracting foreign students to study in Malaysia under the NKEA (New Key Economic Areas) programme. An administrative fees of 10% of the total expenses incurred for Branding of International school was charged to Pemandu for the services provided by NAPEI.

In reference to item 4 above, NAPEI in Year 2015 successfully participated in the last of the International fair under the grant at Raffles City, Singapore in April,2015 (3rd and 4th April) (with ten (10) participating International schools together along with PEMANDU and MOE officials.

The above project was financed from the RM 600,000.00 grant received from PEMANDU (Prime Minister Department) end December 2013 under EPP 3 to promote International Schools. As for this initiative, PEMANDU sponsored the exhibition venue and the participating International

schools paid for their travelling, accommodation and other related expenses.

In Year 2015 an amount of RM16,674 (a 10% administrative income by NAPEI was earned as a revenue) was generated from this activity.

EXPENSES

There was a lower operating expenses in 2015 as compared to 2014. The National Council unanimously concurred that several factors as follows made it possible:
